

## Facts and Figures Is education relevant in the modern world?

## Question: Based on the featured examples below, explain and elaborate how education has shaped the modern society.

In 2016, the Education Cannot Wait (ECW) fund was started to provide free, quality education to children and youth when disaster strikes. - Project Syndicate, 2017

In Uganda, 70% of children who enrol in primary school drop out before they complete primary school.

In the last 15 years, the total number of students worldwide has expanded by about 243 million.

Between 2013 and 2016, there were a total of 71 students who committed suicide in Hong Kong.

In 2014, the US spent a total of \$16,268 on each individual student's education from primary to tertiary level, which was well above the global average of \$10,759. - The Guardian, 2018

Due to a fall in the number of students enrolling in South Korean elementary schools, certain rural schools have started recruiting elderly illiterate grandmothers as pupils to teach them to read and write.
